"These survivors are not just survivors, they are warriors, who have faced breast cancer head-on and are ready to heal and emerge stronger than they were before their diagnosis," said Paula Flory. "We are honored to give them the chance to embark on this incredible adventure, symbolizing their journey from surviving to thriving."

Breast cancer survivors were able to enter for the opportunity to be chosen by submitting a one-minute video describing what the opportunity would mean to them. Although the decision was very difficult, the selected breast cancer survivors demonstrated remarkable courage, determination, and gratitude throughout their battles with breast cancer. The retreat will offer them a chance to connect with likeminded individuals, share experiences, and forge lifelong friendships, all while surrounded by the aweinspiring beauty of Utah's majestic landscapes.

The journey will include a challenging mountain climb, representing the survivors' triumph over breast cancer and their readiness to embark on new chapters in their lives.
